## Overview

IBM® Spectrum Connect is a centralized server system that consolidates a range of IBM storage provisioning, automation, and monitoring solutions through a unified storage management interface.

IBM Spectrum Connect provides a single server backend location and enables centralized management of IBM storage resources for different virtualization and cloud platforms.

The following solution components, referred to as interfaces, are supported by the software package:

- **IBM Storage Provider for VMware VASA** – Improves the ability to monitor and automate storage-related operations on VMware platforms. This includes support for VASA 2.0 and virtual volumes. In addition, it uses Storage Policy Based Management (SPBM) technology for optimizing the virtual machine provisioning process.
- **IBM Storage Enhancements for VMware vSphere Web Client** – Integrate into the VMware vSphere Web Client platform and enable VMware administrators to independently and centrally manage their storage resources on IBM storage systems.
- **IBM Storage Plug-in for VMware vRealize Orchestrator** – Allows VMware administrators to include IBM discovery and provisioning in their vRealize Orchestrator automation workflows.
- **IBM Storage Management Pack for VMware vRealize Operations Manager** – Allows VMware administrators to obtain comprehensive monitoring information about the IBM storage resources that are utilized in their virtualized cloud environment.
- **IBM Storage Enabler for Containers** – Provisions storage volumes from an external IBM storage to container frameworks. Storage provisioning can be fully automatized with additional support of cluster orchestration systems to automatically deploy, scale and manage containerized applications.
- **IBM Storage Automation Plug-in for PowerShell** – Runs cmdlets for provisioning and management of the IBM FlashSystem A9000 and A9000R storage systems and IBM Spectrum Virtualize Family products.

**Note:** IBM Storage Automation Plug-in for PowerShell and IBM Storage Enabler for Containers are not provided as an integral part of the Spectrum Connect package and must be installed separately.

## What's new in version 3.4.0

Version 3.4.0 introduces a range of enhancements and fixes as detailed in the following sections.

**General availability date:** 28 March 2018

## **Synchronous mirroring**

Version 3.4.0 adds support for Spectrum Accelerate Family remote mirroring, allowing VMware administrators to create mirrored volumes automatically via vSphere Web Client. The mirrored volumes can be provisioned with or without consistency groups independently from storage administrators.

## **Local HyperSwap for Spectrum Virtualize systems**

Version 3.4.0 allows the Spectrum Virtualize Family storage systems to use the local HyperSwap data protection function. Similar to the stretched cluster, the local HyperSwap method makes highly-available volumes accessible through two remote sites, while maintaining a fully-independent copy of data at each site. The storage system at a third site acts as a tie-breaking quorum device in this deployment.

## **Data mirroring for Spectrum Virtualize systems**

Version 3.4.0 lets the Spectrum Virtualize Family storage systems to use data mirroring. This high-availability method allows two mirrored copies of the volume to be maintained on the same storage system, while keeping each copy of the volume in a separate storage pool.

## **Host clustering for Spectrum Virtualize systems**

Starting from version 3.4.0, Spectrum Connect supports host clustering for Spectrum Virtualize storage systems. This simplifies host management by providing clustered hosts with identical volume mappings.

## **Registering multiple Spectrum Connect instances on several vCenter servers**

Starting from version 3.4.0, multiple Spectrum Connect instances can be registered as storage providers on several VMware vCenter servers in a mesh topology. In addition, a priority of each instance can be defined, determining priority of all storage systems added to the current Spectrum Connect.

## **IBM Storage Enabler for Containers support by DS8000 Family products**

Version 3.4.0 allows IBM Storage Enabler for Containers to provision volumes from DS8000 Family storage systems for containerized applications.

## **IBM Storage Automation Plug-in for PowerShell support by FlashSystem A9000 and A9000R**

Version 3.4.0 introduces automation in storage provisioning on IBM FlashSystem A9000 and A9000R storage systems using IBM Storage Automation Plug-in for PowerShell.

## **CentOS 7.x and RHEL 6.9 support**

Version 3.4.0 adds support for CentOS version 7.x to bring robustness of this enterprise-class operating system, ensuring resiliency of the Spectrum Connect deployments in business environment. In addition, now you can run Spectrum Connect under RHEL 6.9.

## Performance improvements

Version 3.4.0 improves stability and overall performance of the system in VVol and non-VVol applications.

## Minimum server hardware requirements

The Linux server upon which IBM Spectrum Connect is installed should meet the following minimum hardware requirements:

- 64-bit dual-core CPU
- 4 GB of RAM
- 16 GB of free disk space
- 4 GB swap space

The same requirements apply if a virtual machine is used instead of a physical server.

---

**Note:**

- For best performance, use a dedicated server.
  - The minimum requirements are for supporting up to 20 storage systems and up to 1000 objects (storage resources, volumes, hosts, mappings, snapshots, mirroring groups, consistency groups).

## CPU and memory consumption on vRealize Orchestrator

When the IBM Storage Plug-in for VMware vRealize Orchestrator is used, the CPU and memory consumption impact on the vRealize Orchestrator server is minimal: approximately 2% CPU usage at peak, and less than 1% memory usage.

The server environment on which the IBM Storage Plug-in for VMware vRealize Orchestrator was tested included:

- CPU: 2 vCPU, Intel Xeon X5650 @ 2.67GHz
- Memory: 3088 MB

### Version 3.3.0 (December 2017)

## Limitations

As opposed to known issues, limitations are functionality restrictions that are part of the predefined system design and capabilities in a particular version.

## Data copying limitation

To prevent unauthorized copying, data transfer between virtual machines is subject to the following limitation:

- When a virtual machine with Spectrum Connect installation is cloned from another VM or from a template, Spectrum Connect fails to start, indicating the database corruption. You can use Spectrum Connect backup and restore functionality to copy the application data to new VMs.

## IBM Enabler for Containers does not support volume migration using IBM Hyper-Scale Mobility

IBM Enabler for Containers does not support volume migration using IBM Hyper-Scale Mobility for the storage volumes utilized by Kubernetes clusters.

## Known issues

- **HIPER** – High Impact Pervasive. A critical issue that IBM has either fixed or plans to fix promptly. Requires immediate customer attention or code upgrade.
- **High Impact** – Potentially irrecoverable error that might impact data or access to data in rare cases or specific situations/configurations.
- **Moderate** – Limited functionality issue and/or performance issue with a noticeable effect.
- **Service** – Non-disruptive recoverable error that can be resolved through a workaround.
- **Low** – Low-impact usability-related issue.

---

### Important:

- **The issues listed below apply to version 3.4.0 or earlier versions.** As long as a newer version has not yet been released, a newer release notes edition for version 3.4.0 might be issued to provide a more updated list of known issues and workarounds.
