Function or feature	Description
Support for assimilating FlashCopy pairs for Spectrum Virtualize based storage systems	The Copy Services Manager Discover command can now be used on the FlashCopy session type for Spectrum Virtualize storage systems. Pairs for Spectrum Virtualize FlashCopy based sessions can only be assimilated if they are in a consistency group.
Provide multiple z/OS host connections with the same sysplex name	This new feature enables you to attach multiple z/OS host systems to the same Copy Services Manager server, despite having the same sysplex or monoplex name. This function is going to appear in the GUI and CLI. Select the host system to associate with a Copy Services Manager session, as the concatenation of the sysplex name and the connection information (hostname/ip).
Supports a new hardware reserves option for HyperSwap configurations	This functionality ensures that active hardware reserves on primary PPRC devices are properly transferred to the new primary devices after a HyperSwap, and also helps in sharing devices between sysplexes in a z/OS HyperSwap environment.
View the volume WWN managed by Copy Services Manager	Copy Services Manager now displays and returns the volume WWN when viewing volumes and copy sets along with the volume's full and username. The volume WWN is what a host system displays when mapped to the storage system. Displaying the volume WWN allow customers and external automation to determine which volume displayed in Copy Services Manager is volume that is mapped to the host system.
Migrate to a Copy Services Manager server running on a z/OS system	You can now migrate from an existing Copy Services Manager server running on distributed or z/OS environments to a different Copy Services Manager server running on z/OS system that uses the compressed backup file that is created by the existing server.

Function or feature	Description
View LSS OSS chart for Global Mirror sessions	You can now view LSS Out of Sync (OOS) track historical statistics for a selected session and role pair from the Copy Services Manager GUI. When the RPO chart indicates a higher than expected RPO, the LSS OOS statistics chart can help a customer determine whether there is a high amount of OOS on one or more LSS that could lead to the high RPO.
New ESE Sizer Session type	Copy Services Manager now has a new Extent Space Efficient(ESE) Sizer session for DS8000 storage systems. This session type collects write monitoring data for volumes to help customers better size their space requirements for DS8000 FlashCopy and Safeguarded Copy solutions.
New Fail Flash if Target is online session option	This feature is available for both GUI and CLI. New option on FlashCopy and Practice sessions to Fail Flash if target is online. When checked the flash fails for the specified FlashCopy role pair if the target volume is online to a host. This option is for CKD volumes only.
Migration session now available on Copy Services Manager HMC installations	The new Migration session that was made available in Copy Services Manager 6.2.11 is now available with no charge license that is provided on all DS8000 HMCs with Copy Services Manager preinstalled. It is no longer necessary to purchase the full Copy Services Manager license to use the Migration session type.
Performance improvements for Safeguarded Copy and FlashCopy sessions in a mainframe environment	Starting with Copy Services Manager 6.2.11, if all volumes in the Safeguarded Copy or FlashCopy session are attached to a z/OS sysplex that has IOS APAR OA59561 applied, a customer can associate that sysplex to the session to dramatically enhance the performance for Safeguarded Copy backups and FlashCopy flashes, further minimizing any application impact from the backup or flash commands.

Chapter 4. Known issues and workarounds

The following information describes current known issues with IBM Copy Services Manager Version 6.2.11 and any associated workarounds.

Table 4. IBM Copy Services Manager Version 6.2.11 known issues and workarounds		
Issue	Explanation and possible workaround	
When defined with the same consistency group name, all sessions that share the same DS8000 storage system have the same Master/Subordinate topology, even if there are sessions that do not span the same set of storage systems.	Copy Services Manager supports assigning the same consistency group name to multiple Global Mirror sessions. Master/Subordinate sessions for DS8000 are supported, but limited testing was completed for different combinations of Master/ Subordinate configurations, due to environment limitations.	
	Consult with IBM Support to ensure proper coverage of your required configuration.	
When more than 256 Copy Services Manager sessions are assigned the same consistency group name, internal issues are encountered.	Limit the number of sessions with the same consistency group name to under 256. This issue will be addressed in a future release.	
The Global Mirror options are not synced across sessions that share the same consistency group name. Therefore, when the Global Mirror Master is started, it uses the options that were defined for one of the sessions.	In Copy Services Manager, you can modify certain options for Global Mirror sessions, such as the consistency-group interval time. Ensure that all sessions that have the same consistency group name are also defined with the same Global Mirror options.	
When the Global Mirror data for a session is exported, gaps might result with no data while the session was in a suspended state.	When a Global Mirror session that shares a consistency group name with other sessions is suspended, the suspended session is removed from the Master on the hardware while the other sessions are restarted and continue to form consistency groups. When a session is removed from the Master, Copy Services Manager stops collecting historical Global Mirror data for that session.	
	This code limitation has no current workaround.	
Copy Services Manager does not support the ability to change the Master of the Metro Global Mirror session from the H2 volumes to the H1 volumes without affecting the other Global Mirror sessions that share the consistency group name.	Copy Services Manager supports the ability to use the same consistency group name across a Metro Global Mirror session. However, when running H1>H2, if you issue either a Start H1>H3 to complete an Incremental Resync, or you issue a Suspend/Recover/Start H2H1H3 to switch the direction of the session, the Global Mirror session is terminated at site 2, which affects the other shared Global Mirror sessions. This is a code limitation with no current workaround.

Issue	Explanation and possible workaround
Copy Services Manager does not support local OS authentication.	When you migrate from a Tivoli® Storage Productivity Center for Replication installation that uses local OS authentication to a Copy Services Manager installation (see the IBM Copy Services Manager Installation and Configuration Guide for migration instructions), local OS users are displayed on the Administration page with an indication that they were not found in either the LDAP or Basic User Registries.
	Delete these local OS users, and then either create new basic users for local users, or configure LDAP to use LDAP users or groups for authentication.
There is a known DS8000 issue on certain microcode levels when a relationship is running in Global Copy and switched to a Metro Mirror mode. An error occurs indicating that the multi-target feature is not supported. This problem might be encountered on multi-target Metro Mirror - Global Mirror and multi-target Metro Mirror - Global Mirror with Practice session types.	Suspend the Metro Mirror pairs, and then restart to work around the issue.
After a Recover to Site 3 for a Metro Mirror - Global Mirror with Practice session that uses count-key data (CKD) volumes, when a Start H3->H1->H2 or Start H3->H2->H1 command is issued, the hardware might return an error code 0F74 with Sense Byte 9 set to 0A on the H1-H3 relationships. This situation leads to a full copy of the data from H3 to H1.	There is a known issue after recovering to site 3 for a Metro Mirror - Global Mirror with Practice session using CKD volumes. The Start H3->H1->H3 and Start H3->H2->H1 command attempt to establish failed over relationships from the H3 volume back to H1 to avoid a full copy, as H3 is the target of the FlashCopy relationship and not in the remote copy relationship between site 1 and site 3. Due to the error in setting up the failback to avoid a full copy, the H3 to H1 relationship performs a full copy of the data.
The Start H3H1H2/StartH3H2H1 command on a multi-target Metro Mirror - Global Mirror with Practice session receives a 0F52 hardware error.	During the Start H3H1H2/Start H3H2H1 command operation for a multi-target Metro Mirror - Global Mirror with Practice session, a failover is issued to the H1/H2 volume to later establish H3 to H1/H2. If there are no paths between H1/H2 and H3, you receive a 0F52 error.
	The workaround for this scenario is to ensure that there are paths from H1/H2 to H3 and H3 to H1/H2 before you issue the Start H3H1H2 or H3H2H1 command.

Issue	Explanation and possible workaround	
When you use Copy Services Manager on a DS8000 HMC, the key size for a certificate must be 2048.	On z/OS 2.1, you might encounter a problem due to the key size of a certificate not defaulting to 2048. You can resolve this issue by adding the SIZE(2048) parameter to the RACDCERT statement when you generate a self-signed certificate.	
	For more information, see the topic that is titled "Configuring a secure communication between HyperSwap® and the client" in the Install Guide or online product documentation. Chapter 3, "Publications and related information," on page 5 provides details on where to find this information.	
When you upgrade from a previous version of Copy Services Manager to Version 6.2.0, you might encounter an error when you edit the port pairings CSV file in the GUI.	A new feature in Copy Services Manager 6.2.0 is the ability to add logical paths by editing a sample CSV file in the GUI. However, in previous versions of this file, one of the lines that is supposed to be a comment starts with a dollar (\$) sign instead of a number (#) sign. This situation returns an error.	
	This issue is fixed in Version 6.2.0, but is retained for upgrades. Therefore, be aware that you might encounter this error if you upgrade from an older version of Copy Services Manager.	
There are limitations for DS8000 storage systems when you set a property in the rmserver.properties file on a multi-target session to support Remote Pair FlashCopy in a multi-target environment.	The only option that is currently supported by DS8000 for Remote Pair FlashCopy (Preserve Mirror) is Attempt to preserve Metro Mirror consistency but fail FlashCopy if Metro Mirror target consistency can't be preserved, or restricted mode in the DSCLI.	
	You might receive the following error if you use the wrong option: IWNR1027E: The command Flash in session rpfc-mtc23-12xx has completed with one or more errors. error Jun 6, 2017 4:07:52 PM: csmuser: IWNR2114E: A hardware error occurred during the running of a command for the pair in session rpfc-mtc23-12xx for copy set DS8000:2107.LD581:V0L:1206 with source DS8000:2107.LD581:V0L:1206 and target DS8000:2107.LD581:V0L:1201 in role pair H1-T1. The hardware returned an error code of 0f89. Sense Byte 9: 10.

Issue	Explanation and possible workaround
Unable to connect to older DS8000 storage systems after upgrading Copy Services Manager	After you upgrade Copy Services Manager, the Copy Services Manager server might be unable to connect to older DS8000 storage systems due to updated security protocols.
	Contact support if you encounter problems with connecting to the storage system after upgrade.
Discovery of disconnected storage under FICON® during storage systems refresh	If a storage system disconnects from the FICON attachment under z/OS, its status, along with the parent connection is reported as Degraded and marked with the message: z/OS Device Path Connection Degraded.
	During normal operation, after the device reconnects, the status goes back to Connected for both the device and its connection. However, if a device is disconnected and then removed from the Copy Services Manager storage connection panel, the message is not removed from the parent. The parent continues to display z/OS Device Path Connection Degraded until Copy Services Manager is restarted.
Removal of a Copy Services Manager user also results in the removal of any users that have the same name, but in a different case.	If you have multiple user IDs with the same spelling, but different case, you should not remove any of these user ID variations. Doing so causes all of the users to be removed from the Copy Services Manager access control list, and none of the users are then able to log in to the account. You can add the deleted user back if necessary
	with no errors. Remove the other users from the basicRegistry.xml file, and then they can be added again.
Migration from Tivoli Storage Productivity Center for Replication to Copy Services Manager on z/OS results in some features that fail to start if the rmserver.properties file is in ASCII and not EBCDIC.	Check your rmserver.properties file before you migrate from Tivoli Storage Productivity Center for Replication to Copy Services Manager. If the file is encoded in ASCII, change it to EBCDIC encoding before you proceed with the migration.

The original Global Mirror leg is non-participating and does not affect replication. However, after you swap back, the leg might continue to show the error. If so, the error puts the session in a Target Available and Severe state, even though the swap was successful.			
	To clear the error on the non-participating role pair, another start can be issued, even if the session is already in a Prepared state.			
RACF® LDAP is currently not supported.	LDAP using RACF cannot be supported because the underlying product libraries require full LDAP version 3 compliance. Specifically, it does not support most complex filters.			
APAR OA56173 is required to run Safeguarded Copy sessions when managing the storage system without an HMC connection.	If you only have a z/OS connection (either FICON or IP to z/OS) without an HMC connection, then you cannot run Safeguarded Copy sessions until APAR OA56173 has been applied to the z/OS system.			
When attempting to add a new copy set into a session, after the new copy set has reached a Prepared state, a failure might occur when adding the new volumes into the hardware consistency group.	If you encounter this issue before the 12.3.2.a release of IBM FlashSystem A9000 and A9000R is available, see Known issue: storage systems: Standby mirror for the new copy set does not match that of the consistency group for a detailed			
This situation results in the HyperSwap pairs suspending for both the new copy sets, and the copy sets that are already in the consistency group.	workaround procedure.

If the caller does not have UID(0) access or permission granted to authorized services, the Angel Process must be used. Otherwise the procedure fails and marks the process as program controlled. Changing the cluster name on the Storwize®/SVC device might not get reflected automatically in Copy Services Manager	If you change the name of a cluster that is connected to Copy Services Manager, Copy Services Manager should automatically change the name. If Copy Services Manager does not change the name, then attempt to restart the Copy Services Manager server to force a rediscovery and refresh. If that does not work, then you can rebuild the session with the Remove Copy Set command, keep the session on the hardware, and rebuild the session action plan.			
Error message on zLinux platform installation	During installation on zLinux platforms the following error message appears, but does not cause any problems with the installation, and can be ignored: *** Error in `/opt/IBM/CSM/UninstallerData// liberty/wlp/IBM/Java/jre/bin/java': free(): invalid pointer: 0x0000003ff776971d4 ***

Detailed workaround procedures

The following information describes detailed workaround procedures for IBM Copy Services Manager Version 6.2.11 and earlier, pertaining to certain known issues.

Some issues might require a specific set of ordered steps for the workaround. These steps are detailed below for the issue described.

Known issue: IBM FlashSystem A9000 and A9000R storage systems: Standby mirror for the new copy set does not match that of the consistency group

This issue will be fixed in the 12.3.2.a release of IBM FlashSystem A9000 and A9000R.

If the problem occurs, before that release is available, you can perform the following steps to fix the session and add the new copy set or sets into the session:

Note: This workaround involves swapping the new volumes to the alternate site, and then swapping them back.

- 1. Issue Remove Copy Set from CSM with the Yes, keep the base hardware relationships on the storage system option for the new copy sets that you were attempting to add to the session.
- 2. From the Copy Services Manager GUI: If the session is **Suspended Partial** or **Suspended**, **Suspend** the session and then **Restart** it. Then wait for it to reach the **Prepared** state again.
- 3. From Hyper-Scale Manager or the XCLI:
 - a. Reactivate the multi-target relationships for the copy set or sets that you were attempting to add to the session (if inactive), and wait for it to reach an operational state.
 - b. Deactivate the Asynchronous relationships for all copy sets that you were attempting to add to the session.
 - c. issue **switch roles** on the HyperSwap relationships for all copy sets that you were attempting to add to the session.
 - d. Activate the Asynchronous relationships at the new site for all copy sets that you were attempting to add to the session. At this point the new relationship will be running at the opposite local site from the consistency group, and you will now swap it back.
 - e. Deactivate the Asynchronous relationships for all copy sets that you were attempting to add to the session
 - f. issue **switch roles** on the HyperSwap relationships for all copy sets that you were attempting to add to the session.
 - g. Activate the Asynchronous relationships at the new site for all copy sets that you were attempting to add to the session. At this point you have swapped the new relationships to the other site, and then swapped them back to match the consistency group direction.
- 4. From Copy Services Manager, re-attempt to add the new copy sets into the session. Copy Services Manager will assimilate the existing relationships on the hardware, and then will add the new copy sets into the consistency group.
